Dr. Said Afghani" was born in 1922 in the Laghman province of Afghanistan, as the son of Mawlana Abdel Majeed, one of the most renowned theologians in Afghan history.

After completing his primary education, he began studying theology at Darel Ulume Arabic, where he earned his certificate and became a lecturer.

In 1950, he attended Najmol Madares in Nangarhar province, where he eventually became the headmaster. He honorably retired after ten years. At the age of 42, Dr. Afghani earned his PhD in philosophy and theology from Al-Azhar University in Cairo in 1986.



He became a doctor of philosophy and theology and wrote two of his best-known works, Said Jamaluddin Afghani and Khuadscha Abdullah Ansari.

Dr. Afghani later became a professor at Dar al-Mulammin in Kabul and subsequently at Kabul Polytechnic. In 1972, he, along with other scholars from Kabul University, formed a democratic union known as the Union of Professors and Students.

Dr. Said Afghani served as a judge in Afghanistan's judiciary" President of the Supreme Court of Afghanistan", the Minister of Islamic Affairs, a deputy in the National Front of Afghanistan, and the general chairman of the Supreme Council of Islamic Clergy of Afghanistan.

Dr. Said Afghani is also one of Afghanistan's most famous authors, having written 37 books and over 1,500 articles on topics such as peace, freedom, democracy, as well as literary, social, and political subjects.

Dr. Said Afghani passed away on February 25, 1985, at the age of 63 in Kabul, Afghanistan.

May the soul of Dr. Said Afghani rest in peace and be granted entry to Jannat al-Firdous. Ameen.
